



PREFACE

PILDAT Report on Public Opinion on Quality of Governance in Pakistan: Second Year of Federal and Provincial Governments: June 2014 – May 2015 is the second in a series of reports, the first being published in August 2014, to assess the Quality of Governance in Pakistan through a nationwide public opinion poll. Earlier, upon the completion of first 100 days of these Governments in office in September 2013, PILDAT had undertaken and published a public verdict on Performance of Governance and Democracy in First 100 Days of Pakistan's National and Provincial Governments.

This is the second in a series of reports to examine the Quality of Governance based on public opinion upon the completion of the 2nd year of National and Provincial Governments elected through the May 2013 General Election. As democracy has made progress in Pakistan over the years, PILDAT believes the focus should be on *performance* of democracy, separate from the *process* of democracy, to gauge how democracy has delivered to the citizens in terms of providing good governance.

Framework for Assessing Quality of Governance

In order to assess the quality of governance on a scientific basis, PILDAT has developed an indigenous framework, which takes into account key governance indicators within the context of Pakistan. The framework has been used to develop a questionnaire for the public opinion poll.

The nationwide poll was conducted during **June 02-12, 2015**. It was conceived and undertaken by PILDAT. The respondents for the survey included **3231 citizens** from rural and urban areas from all the four provinces of Pakistan. The fieldwork for the report was done in person at respondents' homes. The sample is also based on a cross-section of various age, income, education and language groups of the population. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-5\%$ at 95% confidence level.

PILDAT's initiative to assess Quality of Governance is by no means an exercise at finger pointing; it is, in fact, a collaborative effort to highlight areas of strengths and potential areas requiring improvement in the quality of governance in the five Governments. This public opinion poll report is an effort to assist elected political Governments at the Centre and the Provinces to improve their quality of governance based on scientifically obtained public opinion.

The results only represent public opinion, computed on the basis of views expressed by anonymous respondents selected through the procedure outlined in the methodology section of this Report. PILDAT cannot be held liable to the users of this data. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY ARY

AFTER TWO YEARS, CHALLENGES TO GOOD GOVERNANCE STILL PERSIST

Two years into the General Elections of 2013, the incumbent Governments have been unable to convince the public over their performance in key areas of governance. The survey by Pakistan's most prominent watcher on democracy and governance, PILDAT, shows that popular opinion over the performance of elected governments, both at the federal and provincial level, has been one of increasing scepticism and mistrust. Despite significant gains made in improving Pakistan's security situation, a majority of the public still feels that the Government has been lacking in its drive to resolve more pressing socio-economic and political problems facing the Country.

The PILDAT Report on Governance awards a number of 'Red Cards' and only a few 'Green Cards' while assessing the performance of the Federal Government for key governance indicators during the past two years. Apart from achieving popular support in only a few major areas, such as **Law and Order**, **National Security**, **Utility Bills Collection**, **Immunization of Children**, **Healthcare and Education**, the overall public evaluation of the Federal Government has been negative. Upon a further interpretation of the survey on governance, PILDAT believes that the public is particularly concerned over a lack of effort by the Federal Government towards espousing accountability and transparency in the working of the bureaucracy and institutions of governance. Subsequently, a majority of the public has disapproved of the workings of all Federal Ministries, with the exception of the Ministry of Defense. The Government's efforts to curb unemployment, alleviate poverty and resolve the energy crisis in the Country have also been viewed scepkically by the public.

The survey findings in this PILDAT report also point to an encouraging public approval on key governance areas for the Provincial Governments of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (KP) as well as the Punjab. The Provincial Government of KP has secured overwhelmingly popular support for its performance in the majority of governance areas. Whereas, the people of Balochistan and Sindh have provided a scathing assessment of their respective Provincial Governments; negatively rating them in most of the governance indicators.

The PILDAT survey shows that popular grievances are getting pinned down on the poor performance of politicians. The politicians running their respective Provincial Governments and the Federal Government are being blamed for their perceived failure to effectively tackle the major issues impeding Pakistan's development as well as showing a lack of sincerity in effectively running their Departments and Ministries.

Additionally, the Report identifies popular distrust for State Institutions of accountability and security, such as the National Accountability Bureau (NAB), Government Officers and the Police. Conversely, a significant section of the population has exhibited a strong trust for the Nation's Armed Forces.

The findings of this PILDAT Report include a number of highlights, which are reported in this Executive Summary. More detailed findings are presented in the 2-volume Report, which PILDAT is releasing for the benefit of all political stakeholders

Federal Government's Scorecard

The scorecard shows the Federal Government's Approval Rating, i.e., sum of responses in category 'Approved a Lot' and 'Approved Somewhat', on the core governance indicators. A rating, less than 50% shows that more people have disapproved or chose to remain silent on the issue. It has been shaded as 'red' on the Approval Scorecard column in Table 2. Similarly, an Approval Rating of more than 50% implies that a minority of the population has expressed disapproval or has chosen to remain silent on the issue. An Approval Rating exceeding 50% has been allotted the colour 'green' on the Approval Scorecard column seen in Table 2. In Table 2, we have also ranked different indicators from highest Approval Rating to lowest Approval Rating, in order to outline areas where the Federal Government has performed well in gaining public's perceived approval.



Figure 1: Governance Track Record - Negative Evaluation Indicators





Performance of the Federal Government - Public Opinion Mostly Negative

The Approval Ratings in 2015 seen in Table 2 show that on most indicators, the public evaluated the Federal Government's governance performance negatively. 24 out of the 30 Governance indicators assessed for the Federal Government received an Approval Rating below 50%, thus implying that the majority of the survey respondents disapproved of the performance of the Federal Government in those 24 indicators. The Federal Government's governance performance has been positively evaluated only on six indicators: Immunization of Children (85%); Education (64%); Utility Bills Collection (56%); Law and Order (55%); Healthcare (54%) and National Security (53%). In all the remaining policy areas that were included in the survey, the majority opinion was one of disapproval on the performance of the Federal Government. On all the remaining policy indicators, more than 50% of the respondents deemed the performance of the Federal Government to be unsatisfactory. On the indicators of Poverty Alleviation (28%), Transparency (30%), Management of Unemployment (25%), Quality & Independence of Civil Service (26%), Merit-based Appointments in Regulatory Bodies (28%), Devolution of Powers to Lower Tiers-Establishment of Local Governments (29%), the public was extremely critical of the Government's performance as can be seen by the fact that Approval Ratings for these indicators were below 30% of all respondents.

Renewed Hope for the Government on Foreign Policy, Procurement, Investment, Agriculture and Development

Crucial distinction must also be made for those indicators where the Approval Ratings are closer to the 50% mark, hence implying that the public's overall assessment on such indicators is currently divided, with negative evaluations slightly outpacing positive evaluations. For instance, on Foreign Policy Management (44%), Development Programmes (44%), Investment Friendliness (44%) and the Management of Supply of Agricultural Inputs (40%), Federal Government's negative evaluation is only slightly greater than its positive assessment. These indicators highlight areas where the Federal Government has managed to perform well, and has also been evaluated positively by a significant proportion of the public. Continued attention and reform in these areas can help improve the Approval Ratings for the Federal Government.

Federal Government Strong in areas of National Security, Education, Immunization of Children, Healthcare and Utility Bills Collection

Public opinion on the Federal Government's two year governance performance indicates that The PML-N led Government has garnered positive assessments by the majority of the public on Immunization of Children (85%), Healthcare (54%), Education (64%), National Security (53%), Law & Order (55%) and Utility Bills Collection (56%). These indicators have been ranked as green on the Approval Scorecard and suggest that the Government's efforts to strengthen Pakistan in these respective areas have been well received by a majority of the Pakistani public. Given Pakistani's on-going struggle against violent militancy and the relative success of the operation Zarb-e-Azb by the Pakistani Army, this positive score reflects the public's expectation that this Government can succeed in purging rampant terrorism and violent militancy in the Country. Furthermore, the aggressive Polio Campaign undertaken by the Federal Government to make Pakistan a Polio-free Nation has been positively perceived by the public.

Ability of the Centre to Curb Poverty and Unemployment - Question Marks Remain

In contrast, the current Government's performance on **Poverty Alleviation** and **Management of Unemployment** has been poorly assessed by the people of Pakistan; with Approval Ratings of **28%** and **25%** respectively. These issues are critical in resuscitating Pakistan's socio-economic growth and development. A negative assessment by an overwhelming majority of the representative sample of the Pakistani public on these indicators reveals the public's dissatisfaction with the Government's efforts of these two years aimed at resolving these key challenges that affect the daily livelihoods of ordinary citizens across the Country.

The Government's often hyped about economic reforms and policies have, as yet, failed to trickle down to the masses in the form of palpable positive changes in livelihoods – with the public feeling that unemployment, and poverty remain the core economic challenges for the people of Pakistan. Alternatively put, the Government's macroeconomic policy reforms may be working, but microeconomic improvements are yet to take root in the country after several years of economic decline and stagnation.

Public Verdict on Resolving the Energy Crisis: Federal Government Remains Clueless

The 'Energy Crisis' in Pakistan continues to remain a massive hurdle in the social and economic development of Pakistan. Despite the Federal Government's apparent efforts and policy focus designed to reform the Energy Sector and increase the production capacity, the Pakistani public has deemed the efforts of these two years as insufficient. On **Energy Production and Management**, the Government was able to get an Approval Rating of only 30%, thus illustrating the substantial level of dissatisfaction with the continuing energy crisis in the country – particularly with incessant load shedding and power outages that have not only caused misery to the urban and rural diaspora but have also crippled industries and businesses nationwide.

A Persistent Lack of Accountability & Transparency in the Public Sector

Accountability and Transparency have been the usual political slogans used by political parties at the time of elections. Good governance enshrined with concepts of 'Accountability and Transparency' have, over the years, also gained public legitimacy as key goals that Pakistan needs to achieve. Public discourse on this issue is visible through media attention it has captured as well as the recent focus by the Supreme Court on a number of graft cases as well as grilling of the Chief Accountability watchdog, the NAB, by the Chief Justice of Pakistan.

The Government scored rather poorly on indicators of Transparency and Anti-Corruption. On **Transparency**, the Government scored an Approval Rating of only 30% (ranked 13th in terms of public approval), while in the fight against corruption the Government fared even worse in the eyes of the public, with the indicator of **Anti-Corruption** getting an even lower Approval Rating of 27%. Furthermore, on **Merit-Based Recruitment and Promotions** (34%, ranked at 11th in terms of public approval), **Poverty Alleviation** (28%, ranked at 14th), **Quality and Independence of Civil Service** (26%, ranked at 17th), a resounding majority of the respondents was convinced that the Government and its supporting institutions of governance are still strongly afflicted with issues of corruption, a lack of merit and fairness in recruitments

and appointments and malpractice. These numbers show that the current Federal Government needs to do more in shaking off the lack of trust and perceptions of rampant corruption in its management of the Country's affairs.

Provincial Government Scorecard (Provincial Governance Evaluation)

The questions included and asked in the provincial segment of the opinion poll asked respondents to evaluate the performance of their Provincial Government on the core governance indicators relevant to Provincial governance.

The Approval Rating Scores published here provide an indication of how residents from each Province evaluated the state of governance in their Province. The list of indicators used for Provincial governance analysis is slightly different and includes subjects that have been devolved to the provinces in the aftermath of the 18th Constitutional Amendment.

Performance of the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Government - A Clear Front-Runner

The KP Government achieved positive Approval Ratings by the majority of the respondents in a resounding 18 out of the 28 Provincial Governance indicators covered in this Study: Law and Order (72%), Education (80%), Healthcare (75%), Transparency (55%), Anti-Corruption (51%), Utility Bills Collection (55%), Merit-Based Recruitments and Promotions (68%), Use of Technologies for Better Governance (58%), Management and Supply of Agricultural Inputs (56%), Immunization of Children (90%), Environmental Sustainability (59%), Access to an Efficient Justice System (59%), Sanitation (52%), Access to Safe Drinking Water (61%), Disaster Preparedness and Management (56%) and Public Transport (57%), thereby dispelling any challenge from the Provincial Government in Punjab, where the PML-N was able to secure Approval Ratings in only 8 out of the 28 governance indicators.

More impressively, the KP Government barely scored negative ratings in almost all of the other indicators, performing substantially better than the Punjab Government in the eyes of the public. A significant proportion of the respondents approved of the performance of the Government in KP on the following performance indicators: Poverty Alleviation (46%), Management of Unemployment (41%), Investment Friendliness (45%), Tax Collection (48%), Development Programmes (49%), and Management of Unemployment (41%). These Approval Ratings illustrate

the positive perception of the work being done by the Government in these areas.

It was only in a few performance indicators that the Provincial Government of KP was viewed by a majority of the respondents to have performed relatively poorly: **Quality & Independence of Civil Service (37%) and Energy Production and Management (40%).** Even then, a significant proportion of the respondents (above 30%) still approved of the work being carried out by the KP Government regarding improvements in Energy production and management and the Civil Service.

Public Perception on Performance of the Provincial Government of Punjab

Despite lagging behind KP in terms of performance, the Provincial Government of Punjab was still able to outscore the rest of the Provincial Governments in terms of performance in the policy areas outlined in this study.

The Punjab Government's best Approval Rating was registered in **Immunization of Children (91%)**. Similarly, the Provincial Government's concerted focus on infrastructure improvement, with **Public Transport** and **Development Programmes** receiving positive Approval Ratings of **61%** and **51%** in 2015, respectively. Much has been made of the Punjab Government's focus on improving the educational infrastructure and services in the Province. At present, the Government's reforms and projects in **Education** garnered a positive Approval Rating of **75%**. Punjab Government also performed well in the **Healthcare** sector, generating a positive response of **60%** by the majority of the respondents. Furthermore, the Government's efforts at stabilising the economy of Punjab also observed a positive perception by the public, as can be seen by the positive Approval Ratings secured by Punjab in the **Collection of Utility Bills (60%)**. In total, the Punjab Government generated positive Governance Approval Ratings in **8 out of the 28** indicators studied for the four provinces.

Approval Ratings for 4 indicators for the Punjab Government were **barely negative**, in comparison to 7 such policy indicators for the KP Government. On these indicators the negative evaluations only slightly outpaced positive assessments of the Provincial Government's performance, which alludes to Approval Ratings that can easily cross the 50% mark if the Provincial Government retains its focus and policy direction: **Investment Friendliness (44%)**, **Management of Supply of Agricultural Products (41%)**, **Access to Safe Drinking Water (44%)**, and **Disaster Preparedness & Management (43%)**.

However, the PML-N led Provincial Government in Punjab also reflects some of the negative scores achieved by the party's Government at the Federal level. The Punjab Government received the lowest Approval Ratings in Energy Production & Management (37%), Poverty Alleviation (29%), Anti-Corruption (23%), Transparency (25%), Management of Unemployment (25%), and Quality and Independence of Civil Service (22%). A majority of the public opinion severely disapproved of the lack of work being done in alleviating poverty and reducing unemployment, both at the Federal and the Provincial level, with Approval Ratings not even crossing the 30% mark. These trends seem to be reflective of the notion that despite initiating macro level projects, the Government of the PML-N is still lacking in providing some of the basic necessities of life to people.

The Government in Balochistan – Public Opinion Overwhelmingly Negative

Of the four provinces evaluated and compared in this study for the respective Provincial Governments' governance performance, the empirical results clearly rank the Provincial Government of Balochistan on the lowest tier in terms of its performance in the governance indicators.

The people of Balochistan evaluated their Provincial Government's governance track-record negatively on **26 out of the 28 indicators** included in this survey. This prevalent negativity in the province reflects the poor state of governance in the Provincial Government. The Balochistan Government scored the lowest Approval Ratings on: **Anti-Corruption (19%), Merit-Based Recruitment and Promotions (18%), Energy Production and Management (18%), Poverty Alleviation (13%), Management of Unemployment (9%), Environmental Sustainability (20%), Access to Safe Drinking Water (20%)** and **Sanitation (14%).** In all these governance indicators, the Approval Rating given to the Provincial Government was less than 20%, thus implying that a dominant majority of the Balochi public was extremely

critical of the performance of the Provincial Government. The Balochistan Government's positive Approval Rating was recorded on Immunization of Children (79%) and Devoluation of Power to the Lower Tiers-Establishment of Local Government (51%). The empirical results obtained from this study clearly indicate that the people of Balochistan are undoubtedly the ones most dissatisfied and disillusioned with the performance of their government, compared to all the other provinces.

Public Verdict on Performance of Sindh Government - One of Extreme Disapproval

The Provincial Government of Sindh also suffered from a fate similar to the one experienced by the Government of Balochistan, two years since coming into power after the elections of 2013. The Government of Pakistan People's Party in Sindh also recorded Approval Ratings below the 50% mark in **26 out of 28 governance indicators**, managing positive Approval Ratings only in **Immunization of Children (77%)** and **Law and Order (53%)**.

The Sindh Government scored the lowest Approval Ratings on: Poverty Alleviation (16%), Management of Unemployment (12%), Access to Safe Drinking Water (18%), Merit-Based Recruitment and Promotions (19%) and Clean, Efficient and Economic Public Procurement(16%). The proportion of the Sindhi respondents that approved of the work being done by the Government in these policy issues was less than 20% of all respondents, thus highlighting the overwhelming negativity persisting among the public regarding the performance of their Government on these areas.

Performance of the Prime Minister: 73% provide Approval Ratings in 2015

While 73% of Pakistanis state that they rate his performance as 'Good' to 'Very Good', 24% rated his performance in the last two years as 'Bad' to 'Very Bad'.



Performance of CM Punjab: 78% provide Approval Ratings in 2015

The Chief Minister of Punjab, Shahbaz Sharif, received the highest rating from respondents across Pakistan, with an aggregate Approval Rating of 78%, eclipsing all others. 33% of the respondents rated his performance as 'Very Good' while 45% rated it as 'Good'. 14% respondents rated his performance as 'Bad' or 'Very Bad'.

Performance of CM Sindh: 29% provide Approval Ratings in 2015

In contrast with CM Punjab, CM Sindh, Syed Qaim Ali Shah, is perceived as a less popular figure by the public. A significant 43% of the respondents rated his performance as 'Bad' or 'Very Bad'. 29% of the respondents rated CM Sindh's performance as 'Good' or 'Very Good'. Thus, the Chief Minister of Sindh received the second lowest Approval Rating amongst the Chief Ministers of the four provinces.

Performance of CM KP: 38% provide Approval Ratings in 2015

Chief Minister of KP, Pervez Khattak's performance ratings are also in the negative when respondents from across Pakistan were asked to evaluate his overall performance. 29% of the respondents rated his performance as 'Bad' or 'Very Bad' while 38% of the public evaluated his performance as 'Good' or 'Very Good'.

Performance of CM Balochistan: 28% provide Approval Ratings in 2015

Chief Minister of Balochistan, Abdul Malik Baloch fares the worst in terms of his overall Approval Rating amongst the ratings of the Chief Ministers of the other provinces. While 28% respondents rated his performance as 'Good' or 'Very Good', a larger proportion of 29% of the public rated his performance as 'Bad' or 'Very Bad'.



Respondents from across Pakistan were asked to evaluate the performance of the four Provincial Governments. The Approval Ratings of each Provincial Government in 2015 are given in Figure 4.

Performance of Punjab Provincial Government: 76% provide Approval Ratings in 2015

32% of the respondents rated the Punjab Government's performance as 'Good' and 44% rated it as 'Very Good'. In comparison, a small proportion of 14% of the respondents rated the performance of the Government as 'Bad' or 'Very Bad'. At this point in time, with an Approval Rating of 77% in 2015, the Punjab Government enjoys the healthiest Approval Rating of the four provinces.

Performance of Sindh Provincial Government: 30% provide Approval Ratings in 2015

The Sindh Government is evaluated negatively by the majority of the respondents from across Pakistan. 43% of all respondents rated the Provincial Government's performance negatively, while only 30% were in approval of the performance of the Provincial Government. Thus, the Government of Sindh's performance is rated as the second lowest out of the four provinces.

Performance of Balochistan Provincial Government: 28% provide Approval Ratings in 2015

The Balochistan Government is evaluated negatively by the majority of the respondents form across Pakistan. 30% of all respondents rated the Provincial Government's performance negatively, while only 28% of the public stood in approval of the Provincial Government. These scores give the Balochistan Provincial Government the lowest Approval Rating in 2015 amongst the four provinces.

Performance of KP Provincial Government: 38% provide Approval Ratings in 2015

The KP Government is also evaluated negatively but still fares better than the Governments of Sindh and Balochistan. 28% of all respondents rated the Provincial Government's performance negatively, while 38% gave a positive assessment of the Provincial Government, thus giving KP an Approval Rating of 38%.



Trust in Institutions; NAB: 30% provide Approval Ratings in 2015

At present, Pakistanis appear uncertain about the National Accountability Bureau (NAB). 31% respondents assert that they have little to no trust at all in the NAB, while 30% report that they have 'Somewhat' to 'A Lot of Trust' in the Bureau, thus giving the NAB the lowest Approval Rating out of the institutions under discussion.

Trust in Institutions; Government Officers: 32% provide Approval Ratings in 2015

A majority of the representative sample of Pakistanis (55%) state that they have little to no trust at all in Government officers. However, only 29% of them state they have 'Somewhat' to 'A Lot of Trust' in the country's bureaucrats, thereby suggesting that the Pakistani public at large does not trust Government officers.

Trust in Institutions; Armed Forces: 75% provide Approval Ratings in 2015

At present, 75% Pakistanis claim to have 'Somewhat' to 'A Lot of Trust' in the Country's Armed Forces, thus becoming the Institution rated the highest by Pakistanis. On the other hand, only 13% Pakistanis state that they have little to no trust at all in the Armed Forces.

Trust in Institutions; Police: 32% provide Approval Ratings in 2015

A substantial 57% of all respondents stated that they had little to no trust at all in Pakistan's Police. Only 32% of the

respondents have 'Somewhat' to 'A Lot of Trust' in the Police Force, thus making it one of the institutions whose performance has been deemed unsatisfactory by the majority of the representative sample of the Pakistani public.

Biggest Current Issue


The biggest identified challenge for the Country is the Energy Crisis, which is currently identified by 25% of the Survey Respondents as the biggest problem facing the state. Unemployment came in second, with 19% Respondents identifying it as a serious challenge for the Country. The problem of maintaining Law & Order and Peace in light of Terrorism ranked as the third biggest problem, as identified by 15% of the respondents. Finally, Poverty was identified by 12% of the public respondents as a major national problem facing the Country at this point in time. However, the problem of Corruption was not perceived as a major issue by Pakistanis; with only 3% of the representative sample of the Pakistani public considering it as a major issue facing Pakistan in 2015.

Performance of Ministry of Commerce: 47% provide Approval Ratings in 2015

The Ministry of Commerce performed decently as an encouraging 47% of the respondents approved of its performance in 2015. 24% however negatively rated the performance of the Ministry.

Performance of Ministry of Defence: 55% provide Approval Ratings in 2015

The Ministry of the Defence was the only Ministry under the Federal Government whose performance was approved by a majority of the respondents, representative of the larger Pakistani Public (55%) in 2015. Only 21% of the public felt that the performance of the Defence Ministry was not up to the mark.

Performance of Ministry of Finance, Revenue, Economic Affairs, Statistics and Privatisation: 33% provide Approval Ratings in 2015

The performance of this particular Ministry was positively rated by a minority of the respondents as less than 50% of the public (33%) voted the performance as 'Very Good' or 'Good' in 2015. On the other hand, 32% of the survey respondents rated the performance of the Ministry of Finance, Revenue, Economic Affairs, Statistics and Privatisation as 'Bad' or 'Very Bad'.

Performance of Ministry of Foreign Affairs: 37% provide Approval Ratings in 2015

The Ministry of Foreign Affairs was positively voted by less than half of the respondents as only 37% Pakistanis rated the Ministry's performance as 'Good' or 'Very Good'. On the other hand, 27% respondents perceived the performance of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs to be 'Bad' or 'Very Bad'.

Performance of Ministry of Information, Broadcasting and National Heritage: 41% provide Approval Ratings in 2015

The Ministry of Information, Broadcasting and National Heritage did comparatively better as 41% of the respondents approved of the performance of this Ministry in 2015. With added effort, the Approval Ratings for this Ministry have the potential to outpace the fifty percent mark and resultantly gain the approval of the majority of Pakistanis. As it stands, 25% of the public has voted the performance of this Ministry as Bad or Very Bad.

Performance of Ministry of Information Technology and Telecommunication: 45% provide Approval Ratings in 2015

The Ministry of Information Technology and Telecommunication also performed well as a significant proportion of the Pakistani public (45%) surveyed, gave approval in 2015, only a few percentage points behind the majority approval mark of fifty percent. Conversely, only 21% Pakistanis gave negative reviews over the performance of this Ministry. Further improvements in the workings of this Ministry can contribute in this Ministry being approved by a majority of the Pakistani public.

Performance of Ministry of Interior and Narcotics Control: 28% provide Approval Ratings in 2015 A majority of the public disapproved of the performance of this Ministry. Only 28% of the respondents rated the performance of the Ministry of Interior and Narcotics Control as Good or Very Good. On the other hand, a significant 38% of the public believed the performance of this Ministry to be 'Bad' or 'Very Bad'.

Performance of Ministry of Petroleum and Natural Resources: 40% provide Approval Ratings in 2015 The Approval Ratings for this Ministry also exhibit encouraging signs as a significant 40% of the public rated the performance of this Ministry as 'Good' or 'Very Good'. This implies that with added effort, the Approval Rating can be improved to constitute the opinion of the majority of Pakistanis. On the flip side, 35% of the public felt that the performance of this Ministry was 'Bad' or 'Very Bad' in 2015.

Performance of Ministry of Planning, Development and Reforms: 40% provide Approval Ratings in 2015

A significant proportion of the respondents (40%) approved of the performance of this Ministry in 2015. Hence, additional improvements in the performance of the Ministry of Planning, Development and Reforms can result in the Approval Ratings crossing the fifty percent mark and thus being approved by a majority of the public. As it stands in 2015, 27% Pakistanis still feel the performance of this Ministry is not up to the mark and have voted 'Bad' or 'Very Bad' against it.

Performance of Ministry of Railways: 43% provide Approval Ratings in 2015

The Performance of Ministry of Railways in 2015 was encouraging as 43% respondents were in approval. On the other hand, 33% of the responded were in disapproval of the performance of this Ministry.

Performance of Ministry of Water and Power: 27% provide Approval Ratings in 2015

The performance of this Ministry was rated negatively by a majority of the public respondents as 56% of them felt that the performance was 'Bad' or 'Very Bad'. On the other hand, only 27% of the respondents felt that the performance of the Ministry was 'Good' or 'Very Good'.



Performance of Provincial Department for Education: Highest Approval Rating for KP in 2015

A resounding majority of the respondents of KP approved of the performance of the Provincial Department for Education within their respective Province as 86% respondents felt that the performance was 'Very Good' or 'Good'. Both Punjab and Balochistan recorded Approval Ratings above 50%, hence the majority of the respondents in these provinces were positive regarding the work done by their Governments regarding education. Sindh recorded the lowest Approval Rating as only 41% of the public approved of the performance of Sindh Government.

Performance of Provincial Department for Health: KP Records Highest Approval Rating in 2015

The Provincial Department for Health performed well in KP as a significant 85% of the respondents rated its as 'Good' or 'Very Good'. Punjab came in second with an Approval Rating of 67%. In both Balochistan (49%) and Sindh (38%), the majority of the public negatively rated the performance of their respective Government.

Performance of Provincial Home Department: Negative Approval Rating for all Provinces except KP in 2015

A majority of the public negatively rated the performance of the Provincial Home Department. Only a minority of the public approved of the performance of their Government regarding this Department in Balochistan (39%), Punjab (33%) and Sindh (33%). However, a majority of respondents in KP (57%) approved of the performance of the Home Department in 2015.

Performance of Provincial Department for Finance: Negative Approval Rating for all Provinces except KP in 2015 The Finance Department also generally performed poorly at the Provincial level as a minority of the public of Punjab (31%), Sindh (24%) and Balochistan (31%) rated its performance as 'Good' or 'Very Good'. On the other hand, 56% respondents in KP approved of the performance of the Finance Department and voted either 'Good' or 'Very Good'.

Performance of Provincial Department for Agriculture: Negative Approval Rating for all Provinces except KP in 2015

The Department of Agriculture also performed poorly in Punjab (40%), Sindh (25%) and Balochistan (22%) as the majority respondents in these Provinces rated the Provincial Department negatively, either 'Bad' or 'Very Bad'. In KP, a majority (53%) approved of the performance of their Provincial Department for Agriculture.

Performance of Provincial Department for Water and Irrigation: Negative Approval Rating for all Provinces except KPin 2015

The Department of Water and Irrigation also generally performed poorly at the Provincial level as a minority of the public of Punjab (39%), Sindh (22%) and Balochistan (16%) rated its performance as 'Good' or 'Very Good'. On the other hand, 53% respondents in KP approved of the performance of the Department and voted either 'Good' or 'Very Good'.

Performance of Provincial Department for Telecommunication: Negative Approval Rating for all Provinces except KPin 2015

The Department for Telecommunication also performed poorly in Punjab (35%), Sindh (25%), and Balochistan (28%) as the majority respondents in these Provinces rated the Provincial Department negatively, either 'Bad' or 'Very Bad'. In KP, a majority (50%) approved of the performance of their Provincial Department.

Performance of Provincial Department for Local Governments: Negative Approval Rating for all Provinces except KPin 2015

The Department for Local Governments also performed poorly in Punjab (26%), Sindh (23%), and Balochistan (34%) as the majority respondents in these Provinces rated the Provincial Department negatively, either 'Bad' or 'Very Bad'. In KP, a majority (56%) approved of the performance of their Provincial Department.

Performance of Provincial Department for Mines and Minerals: People from all Provinces provide Negative Approval Ratings in 2015

The Provincial Department for Mines and Minerals was ranked the lowest in terms of performance by all respondents in 2015 as the majority public of all the Provinces rated their respective Provincial Departments negatively. A minority of the respondents in Punjab (16%), Sindh (18%), Balochistan (19%) and KP (36%) rated the performance of their Department for Mines and Minerals as 'Good' or 'Very Good'. The majority rated the performance as 'Bad' or 'Very Bad'.

Performance of Provincial Department for Forestry: Highest Approval Rating for KP in 2015

The Department for Forestry also performed poorly in all Provinces except KP as it got the approval of only a minority of the respondents in the Provinces. 55% respondents in KP felt that the performance of their Department was 'Very Good' or 'Good'. In comparison, only 24%, 18% and 22% respondents in Punjab, Sindh and Balochistan respectively, approved of the performance of their respective Provincial Departments.

Performance of Provincial Department for Planning and Development: People from all Provinces provide Negative Approval Ratings in 2015

The Department for Planning and Development was ranked negatively in terms of performance by all respondents in 2015 as the majority public of all the Provinces rated their respective Provincial Departments negatively. A minority of the respondents in Punjab (39%), Sindh (29%), Balochistan (29%) and KP (48%) rated the performance of their Departments as 'Good' or 'Very Good'. The majority rated the performance as 'Bad' or 'Very Bad'.

Public Opinion on Law and Order - 55% provide Approval Rating in 2015

According to the survey, 38% gave a negative rating while 55% gave a positive rating to the Government regarding the issue of law and order. The overall Approval Rating is therefore at 55%.

Public Opinion on Poverty Alleviation - 28% provide Approval Rating in 2015

According to the survey, 28% provided a positive rating for the alleviation of poverty under the current Government while 69% provided a negative rating. The overall Approval Rating is therefore 28%.

Public Opinion on Education - 64% provide Approval Rating in 2015

According to the survey 64% respondents gave positive ratings to education under the Federal Government while 32% gave a negative rating.

Public Opinion on Healthcare - 54% provide Approval Rating in 2015

The public opinion on the effectiveness of Healthcare system stands at an overall 54% positive Approval Rating by the public. On the other hand, 41% of the public gave a negative rating.

Public Opinion on Transparency - 30% provide Approval Rating in 2015





















































According to the survey, 44% gave a positive rating while 54% gave a negative rating to the Provincial Government regarding the issue of law and order. The overall Approval Rating is therefore at 44%.

Public Opinion on Poverty Alleviation - 13% provide Approval Rating in 2015

13% provided a positive rating to the alleviation of poverty under the current Government while a large majority of 84% of the Balochi people provided a negative rating. The overall Approval Rating is therefore only 13%.

Public Opinion on Education - 45% provide Approval Rating in 2015

According to the survey 45% of the Balochi public gave positive ratings to education under the Provincial Government while 51% gave a negative rating.

Public Opinion on Health Care - 35% provide Approval Rating in 2015

The public opinion on the effectiveness of health care system stands at an overall 35% of the public in approval. On the other hand, a majority 63% of the public gave a negative rating.

Public Opinion on Transparency - 24% provide Approval Rating in 2015

On the issue of transparency, 24% of the respondents viewed Government organizations as positive while 50% rated it negatively. Hence the overall Approval Rating in 2015 stood at a mere 24% of the Balochi respondents.

Public Opinion on Energy Production and Management - 18% provide Approval Rating in 2015

18% of the respondents rated energy production and

management positively while a majority 79% of the Balochi public rated it negatively. The Approval Rating in 2015 stood at just 18%.

Public Opinion on Anti- Corruption - 19% provide Approval Rating in 2015

Survey results show that only 19% people rated anticorruption efforts as positive while 68% viewed them as negative. The Approval Rating in 2015 for actions taken against corruption is therefore 19%.

Public Opinion on Investment Friendliness - 32% provide Approval Rating in 2015

32% of those questioned rated the investment friendliness efforts as positive and 46% as negative. Hence the Approval Rating meter stands out at 32% of the public of Balochistan.







































According to the survey, 51% gave a positive rating while 40% gave a negative rating to the Provincial Government regarding the issue of law and order. The overall Approval Rating is therefore at 51%.

Public Opinion on Poverty Alleviation - 29% provide Approval Rating in 2015

29% provided a positive rating to the alleviation of poverty under the current Government while a large majority, 68% of the Punjabi respondentsprovided a negative rating. The overall Approval Rating is therefore 29%.

44% of those questioned rated the investment friendliness efforts as positive and 19% as negative. Hence the Approval Rating meter stands out at 44% of the public of Punjab.

Public Opinion on Tax Collection - 35% provide Approval Rating in 2015

The public's perception of the tax collection tactics of the Provincial Government stood at 34% of the respondents in disapproval. The Approval Rating in 2015 came out to be 35% of the sample population.





















According to the survey, 53% gave a positive rating while 42% gave a negative rating to the Provincial Government regarding the issue of law and order. The overall Approval Rating is therefore at 53%.

Public Opinion on Poverty Alleviation - 16% provide Approval Rating in 2015

16% provided a positive rating to the alleviation of poverty under the current Government while a large majority, 81% of the Sindhi respondentsprovided a negative rating. The overall Approval Rating is therefore 16%.









Comparative Position with respect to Zardari - 59% believe performance was improved in 2015

When respondents were asked to compare Prime Minister Nawaz Sharif's Government with that of the PPP's tenure under President Zardari, the majority; 59% claimed that Nawaz Sharif's Government has performed better.

Comparative Position with respect to Musharraf - 50% believe performance was improved in 2015

While 50% respondents reported that the current Government is performing better as compared to Musharraf's regime, 28% assessed the performance as worse.

Future Possibility - 56% optimistic about 'Improvement of Economy' in 2015

56% of the respondents believe that this Government has 'A Lot of Chance' to 'Somewhat of a Chance' in strengthening Pakistan's economy during its tenure. On the contrary, 32% are more pessimistic on this assessment, and reported that the current Government has 'Very Little Chance' to 'No Chance at All' to improve Pakistan's economy.

Future Possibility - 61% optimistic about 'Improvement of Peace and Stability' in 2015

A majority of the respondents expect this Government to improve the security situation (61%), while a significant proportion (34%) believe that the Government has 'Very Little Chance' to 'No Chance' of achieving this objective.

Future Possibility - 54% optimistic about 'Controlling Terrorism' in 2015

41% of the respondents are pessimistic when it comes to gauging the PML-N Government's ability to rid the country of terrorism, while 54% are more hopeful and see the potential in this Government of successfully eliminating terrorism from the Country.

Future Possibility - 32% optimistic about 'Decreasing Unemployment' in 2015

64% of the respondents doubt that the Government can erase widespread unemployment, while only 32% remain hopeful about the Government's ability to generate economic growth required for expanding employment opportunities.

Future Possibility - 29 % optimistic about 'Poverty Reduction' in 2015

A substantial 65% of the surveyed public thinks that the current Government has 'Very Little' to 'No Chance at All' in alleviating poverty in Pakistan. Only 29%

remain hopeful and believe that the Government will be able to significantly rectify the issue of poverty in the Country.

Future Possibility - 38% optimistic about 'Improving relations with the United States of America' in 2015

Less than half the respondents (38%) believe that the PML-N Government has 'Somewhat' to 'A Lot of Chance' for improving relations with the United States. However, an equally large proportion of the respondents (30%) see this Government's as having 'Very Little' to 'No Chance at All' of improving bilateral relations with the US.

Future Possibility - 29% optimistic about 'Improving relations with India' in 2015

While only 29% of the respondets believe that the Government has a good chance at attaining this objective, a marginally higher 38% of all respondents doubt that the efforts at harmonizing relations with India would bare fruit.

Future Possibility – 36% optimistic about 'Improving relations with Afghanistan' in 2015

36% of the respondents believe that the incumbent Government has a 'Somewhat' to 'A Lot of Chance' of improving relations with the State of Afghanistan. However, a significant proportion (29%) is of the view that the Government will be unable to improve relations with its western neighbour.

Trust in Institutions: National Accountability Bureau - 30% provide Approval Ratings in 2015

At present, Pakistanis appear uncertain about the NAB. 31% respondents assert that they have 'Little' to 'No Trust at All' in the National Accountability Bureau, while 30% report that they have 'Somewhat' to 'A Lot of Trust' in the Bureau.

Trust in Institutions: Government Officers - 32% provide Approval Ratings in 2015

55% of the respondents state that they have 'Little' to 'No Trust' at all in Government officers. Only 32% respondents state they have 'Somewhat' to 'A Lot of Trust' in the country's bureaucrats.

Trust in Institutions: Armed Forces - 75% provide Approval Ratings in 2015

At present, an overwhelming 75% of the respondents claim to have 'Somewhat' to 'A Lot of Trust' in Pakistan's Armed Forces. In contrast, only 13% state that they have 'Little' to 'No Trust at All' in the Armed Forces.

Trust in Institutions: Police - 32% provide Approval Ratings in 2015

A substantial 57% of all respondents stated that they had' Little' to 'No Trust at All' in Pakistan's Police. In comparison, only 32% of the respondents expressed trust in the Police force.

Performance of the Prime Minister - 73% provide Approval Ratings in 2015

While a resounding 73% of the respondents rated his performance as 'Good' to 'Very Good', only 24% rated his performance in the last two years as 'Bad' or 'Very Bad'

Performance of the Chief Minister of Punjab-78% provide Approval Ratings in 2015

By far the most popular Chief Minister in Pakistan out of all the provinces, 78% of the respondents rated his performance as 'Good' to 'Very Good'. Only 14% respondents rated his performance as 'Bad' or 'Very Bad'.

Performance of the Chief Minister of Sindh - 29% provide Approval Ratings in 2015

A significant 43% of the respondents rated his performance as 'Bad' or 'Very Bad'. Only 29% of the respondents rated the performance of the Chief Minister of Sindh's as 'Good' or 'Very Good'.

Performance of the Chief Minster of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa - 38% provide Approval Ratings in 2015

Chief Minister of KP's performance ratings are also in the negative at this point in time. 29% of the respondents rated his performance as 'Bad' or 'Very Bad' while a relatively encouraging 38% evaluated his performance as 'Good' or 'Very Good'.

Performance of the Chief Minister of Balochistan - 28% provide Approval Ratings in 2015

A majority of the public gave a negative assessment of the performance of Chief Minister of Balochistan. While 28% respondents rated his performance as 'Good' or 'Very Good', 29% rated his performance as 'Bad' or 'Very Bad'.

Performance of the Provincial Government of Punjab - 76% provide Approval Ratings in 2015

76% of the respondents rated the Punjab Government's performance as 'Good' to 'Very Good'. Only 14% respondents rated the performance of the Government as 'Bad' or 'Very Bad'. At this point in time, the Punjab Government enjoys the healthiest Approval Rating of

the four provinces.

Performance of the Provincial Government of Sindh - 30% provide Approval Ratings in 2015

The Sindh Government is evaluated negatively by a relative majority of the respondents from across Pakistan. A significantly large proportion (43%) of all respondents rated the Provincial Government's performance negatively, while only 30% were in approval of the performance of the Government in 2015.

Performance of the Provincial Government of Balochistan - 28% provide Approval Ratings in 2015

The Balochistan Government is evaluated negatively by a significant proportion of the respondents from across Pakistan. 31% of all respondents rated the Provincial Government's performance negatively, while only 28% of the public approved of the performance of the Government.

Performance of the Provincial Government of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa - 38% provide Approval Ratings in 2015

The KP Government's performance was also deemed unsatisfactory by a significant ratio of respondents across Pakistan. 28% of all respondents rated the Provincial Government's performance negatively, while 38% approved of the performance of the Government.

Performance of the Ministry of Commerce: 47% provide Approval Ratings in 2015

The Ministry of Commerce performed decently as an encouraging 47% of the respondents approved of its performance in 2015. 24% however negatively rated the performance of the Ministry.

Performance of the Ministry of Defence: 55% provide Approval Ratings in 2015

The Ministry of the Defence was the only Ministry under the Federal Government whose performance was approved by a majority of the respondents (55%) in 2015. Only 21% of the public felt that the performance of the Defence Ministry was not up to the mark.

Performance of the Ministry of Finance, Revenue, Economic Affairs, Statistics and Privatisation: 33% provide Approval Ratings in 2015

The performance of this particular Ministry was positively rated by a minority of the respondents

as less than fifty percent of the public (33%) voted the performance as 'Very Good' or 'Good' in 2015. On the other hand, 32% Pakistanis rated the performance of the Ministry of Finance, Revenue, Economic Affairs, Statistics and Privatisation as 'Bad' or 'Very Bad'.

Performance of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs: 37% provide Approval Ratings in 2015 The Ministry of Foreign Affairs was positively voted by less than half of the respondents as only 37% Pakistanis rated the Ministry's performance as 'Good' or 'Very Good'. On the other hand, 27% Pakistanis perceived the performance of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs to be 'Bad' or 'Very Bad'.

Performance of the Ministry of Information, Broadcasting and National Heritage: 41% provide Approval Ratings in 2015

The Ministry of Information, Broadcasting and National Heritage did comparatively better as 41% of the respondents approved of the performance of this Ministry in 2015. With added effort, the Approval Ratings for this Ministry have the potential to outpace the fifty percent mark and resultantly gain the approval of the majority of Pakistanis. As it stands, 25% of the public has voted the performance of this Ministry as 'Bad' or 'Very Bad'.

Performance of the Ministry of Information Technology and Telecommunication: 45% provide Approval Ratings in 2015

The Ministry of Information Technology and Telecommunication also performed well as a significant proportion of the respondents (45%) gave approval in 2015, only a few percentage points behind the majority approval mark of fifty percent. Conversely, only 21% respondents gave negative reviews over the performance of this Ministry. Further improvements in the workings of this Ministry can contribute in this Ministry being approved by a majority of the Pakistani public.

Performance of the Ministry of Interior and Narcotics Control: 28% provide Approval Ratings in 2015

A majority of the respondents disapproved of the performance of this Ministry. Only 28% of the respondents rated the performance of the Ministry of Interior and Narcotics Control as 'Good' or 'Very Good'. On the other hand, a significant 38% of the public believed the performance of this Ministry to be 'Bad' or

'Very Bad'.

Performance of the Ministry of Petroleum and Natural Resources: 40% provide Approval Ratings in 2015

The Approval Ratings for this Ministry also exhibit encouraging signs as a significant 40% of the public rated the performance of this Ministry as 'Good' or 'Very Good'. This implies that with added effort, the Approval Rating can be improved to constitute the opinion of the majority of Pakistanis. On the flip side, 35% of the public felt that the performance of this Ministry was 'Bad' or 'Very Bad' in 2015.

Performance of the Ministry of Planning, Development and Reforms: 40% provide Approval Ratings in 2015

A significant proportion of the respondents (40%) approved of the performance of this Ministry in 2015. Hence, additional improvements in the performance of the Ministry of Planning, Development and Reforms can result in the Approval Ratings crossing the fifty percent mark and thus being approved by a majority of the public. As it stands in 2015, 27% of the public still feel the performance of this Ministry is not up to the mark and have voted 'Bad' or 'Very Bad' against it.

Performance of the Ministry of Railways: 43% provide Approval Rating in 2015

An encouraging and significant proportion (43%) of the respondents approved of the performance of the Ministry of Railways in 2015. On the other hand, 31% of the public felt that the performance was not satisfactory and hence voted in the negative.

Performance of the Ministry of Water and Power: 27% provide Approval Ratings in 2015
The performance of this Ministry was rated negatively by a majority of the public as 56% respondents felt that the performance was 'Bad' or 'Very Bad'. On the other hand, only 27% of the respondents felt that the performance of the Ministry was 'Good' or 'Very Good'

Performance of the Provincial Department for Education: Highest Approval Rating for KP in 2015 A resounding majority of the public of KP approved of the performance of the Ministry of Education within their respective province as 86% respondents felt that the performance was 'Very Good' or 'Good'. Both Punjab and Balochistan recorded Approval Ratings above 50%, hence the majority of the public in these provinces was positive regarding the work done by

their Governments regarding education. Sindh recorded the lowest Approval Rating as only 41% of the respondents approved of the performance of Sindh Government.

Performance of the Provincial Department for Health: KP Records Highest Approval Rating in 2015

The Ministry of Health performed well in KP as a significant 85% of the respondents rated the performance of the Ministry as 'Good' or 'Very Good'. Punjab came in second with an Approval Rating of 67%. In both Balochistan (49%) and Sindh (38%), the majority of the public negatively rated the performance of their respective Government.

Performance of the Provincial Home Department: Negative Approval Rating for all Provinces except KPin 2015

A majority of the public negatively rated the performance of the Interior Ministry. Only a minority of the public approved of the performance of their Government regarding this Department in Balochistan (39%), Punjab (33%) and Sindh (33%). However, a majority of respondents in KP (57%) approved of the performance of the Ministry of Interior in 2015

Performance of the Provincial Department for Finance: Negative Approval Rating for all Provinces except KP in 2015

The Finance Department also generally performed poorly at the Provincial level as a minority of the public of Punjab (31%), Sindh (24%) and Balochistan (31%) rated its performance as 'Good' or 'Very Good'. On the other hand, 56% respondents in KP approved of the performance of the Finance Department and voted either 'Good' or 'Very Good'.

Performance of the Provincial Department for Agriculture: Negative Approval Rating for all Provinces except KP in 2015

The Department of Agriculture also performed poorly in Punjab (40%), Sindh (25%) and Balochistan (22%) as the majority public in these Provinces rated the Provincial Government negatively, either 'Bad' or 'Very Bad'. In KP, a majority (53%) approved of the performance of their Provincial Government.

Performance of the Provincial Department for Water and Irrigation: Negative Approval Rating for all Provinces except KP in 2015

The Department of Water and Irrigation also generally

performed poorly at the Provincial level as a minority of the public of Punjab (39%), Sindh (22%) and Balochistan (16%) rated its performance as 'Good' or 'Very Good'. On the other hand, 53% respondents in KP approved of the performance of the Department and voted either 'Good' or 'Very Good'.

Performance of the Provincial Department for Telecommunication: Negative Approval Rating for all Provinces except KP in 2015

The Department for Telecommunication also performed poorly in Punjab (35%), Sindh (25%), and Balochistan (28%) as the majority public in these Provinces rated the Provincial Government negatively, either 'Bad' or 'Very Bad'. In KP, a majority (50%) approved of the performance of their Provincial Government.

Performance of the Provincial Department for Local Governments: Negative Approval Rating for all Provinces except KP in 2015

The Department for Local Governments also performed poorly in Punjab (26%), Sindh (23%), and Balochistan (34%) as the majority public in these Provinces rated the Provincial Government negatively, either 'Bad' or 'Very Bad'. In KP, a majority (56%) approved of the performance of their Provincial Government.

Performance of the Provincial Department for Mines and Minerals: People from all Provinces provide Negative Approval Ratings in 2015 The Ministry of Mines and Minerals was ranked the lowest in terms of performance by all Pakistanis in 2015 as the majority public of all the Provinces rated their respective Provincial Governments negatively. A minority of the respondents in Punjab (16%), Sindh (18%), Balochistan (19%) and KP (36%) rated the performance of their Government as 'Good' or 'Very Good'. The majority rated the performance as 'Bad' or 'Very Bad'.

Performance of the Provincial Department for Forestry: Highest Approval Rating for KP in 2015

The Department of Forestry also performed poorly in all Provinces except KP as it got the approval of only a minority of the public in the provinces. 55% respondents in KP felt that the performance of their Government was 'Very Good' or 'Good'. In comparison, only 24%, 18% and 22% respondents in Punjab, Sindh and Balochistan respectively, approved of the















































































Appendix A: Research Methodology

Sampling Methodology

1. Sample Size

The sample size for this survey is 3231 Men and Women

2. Coverage & Exclusion

The sample covered a total of 56 Districts, in all Four Provinces of Pakistan namely: Punjab , Sindh , KP and Balochistan.

About 5% of Population living in FATA, GB and AJK was excluded from the sample universe for this survey due to security reasons as well as inability to undertake Random Sampling methodology.

3. Sampling Stages

a. Definitions

Sampling Frams

The Sampling Frame for this survey was based on electoral lists updated for 2013 General Election. The Polling Station breakdown and list of polling stations was obtained from the Election Commission of Pakistan's (ECP) website. The electoral lists for sampled polling stations were requested and obtained from the Election Commission office in Islamabad in hard copy form after the required payment was made.

PSU

The Primary Sampling Unit for this survey was the polling station

SSU

The Secondary Sampling Unit for this survey was the respondent (Male or Female) randomly chosen from the electoral rolls.

b. Sampling Stages

Stage 1: Pakistan's National Assembly is composed of 272 National Assembly constituencies. These 272 seats are spread across 4 Provinces and FATA according to population share. Systematic Random Sampling (SRS) method was used to select 55 constituencies from the total list of 272.

3 Constituencies falling in FATA region were dropped due to security concerns in FATA.

Stage 2: From the selected 52 constituencies (after dropping the 3 FATA constituencies) all the Polling Stations in these 52 constituencies were listed. 4 Polling Stations were selected through Simple Random Sampling (SRS) from each constituency.

Since size of electoral constituencies in Pakistan is not uniform and can range from 100,000 voters to 600,000 voters, this method of Systematic Random Sampling gave a slight over weight to smaller constituencies at the cost of the bigger constituencies. This can be considered as one of the limitations of the current sampling exercise.

- **Stage 3:** The Polling Stations were categorised into Rural and Urban polling stations with available data from the Pakistan Bureau of Statistics.
- **Stage 4:** For each of the 3 provinces (Punjab, Sindh and KP) 16 interviews were planned in each of the PSUs, i.e., Polling Stations. In Balochistan, 24 interviews were planned in each of the PSUs, i.e., Polling Stations.
- **Stage 5:** Once the Polling Station and sample to be covered per Polling Station was available, two separate procedures were employed, depending on the availability of electoral rolls or voter lists.

PSUs where electoral rolls were available: 12 Male names and 12 female names were drawn from the electoral rolls using Systematic Random Sampling approach. In Balochistan, where interviews per PSU were 24, 18 male and 18 female names were generated from the electoral rolls of the relevant PSU, i.e., Polling Station.

Using the address and name available, the required respondent was searched by interviewers. In case of lack of availability of selected person, the person was replaced with another one from the 24 (or 36 in Balochistan) available with the interviewer. In other words, substitution of respondent was handled by drawing an oversample from the list.

A total of 24 Constituencies (out of 52) followed this method. In other words, around half of the sample survey responses followed this method.

PSUs where electoral rolls were either unavailable or were found to be incomplete.

In these PSUs, a Random Walk Approach with a random starting point was used. The interviewer first listed all the available landmarks around the Polling Station. He/She used a random number generator to select one random location and then used the 'Right Hand Rule' to select first household. Within the household(HH) selected, KISH Grid was used to select a random member of the HH who was the interviewed.

In case of lack of availability of the selected person the entire HH was replaced instead of interviewing from the same HH.

A total of 28 Constituencies (out of 52) followed this method.

The achieved sample is very close to National Demographics as measured in the Census of 1998 and Demographic Profile emerging from the Pakistan Social and Living Measurement Survey (PSLM 2013-14).

However, there are a few deviations in the Provinces (Balochistan has been given a larger representation, almost twice its size whereas Punjab's share has been reduced by about 4 percentage points). Similarly, the profile of this sample is slightly less youthful than the National Demographics and also slightly more educated than the National demographics.

5. Weighting of Data

Since the deviation in Sample Profile and National Demographics is deemed by PILDAT as not very large, data has not been weighted and the figures reported in this study are based on the Sample Profile shared above.

Disclaimer: The Urban / Rural division of Polling stations has been done based on the available information. In some areas Polling Stations have mixed populations, i.e., Urban as well as Rural Households. An estimation has been used to put these Mixed Polling Stations into Urban or Rural if greater population lived in either Urban or Rural. In other words, a small minority of Households in Rural areas may have been categorised into Urban respondents and vice versa. It is assumed as one of the crucial limitations of the current sampling approach.

6. Error Margin Calculation

The Error Margin for this survey is calculated to range between +-2-5 % at 95% Confidence Interval.

Due to larger cluster size at the PSU level (16 and 24), the design effect for the study would be slightly larger than 10 interviews per PSU, which is generally the norm for polling in Pakistan.

7. Field Work Force

A mixed team of male and female interviewers was used.

The total team comprised 74 individuals

The basic qualification for interviewers was Graduation, mostly unemployed people were selected but about 50% were experienced in interviewing.

8. Field Dates

The field work for this survey was conducted during June 02 – June 12, 2015.

9. Other Protocols followed

Briefing/Training of interviewers:

Briefings were organised for the interviewers on the designed questionnaire in two days training sessions at each Provincial Capital (Lahore, Karachi, Peshawar and Quetta). The interviewers were instructed on measures such as:

Mock Calls

After the briefings were completed, all the field workers made mock calls under the direct supervision of an executive or a fieldwork supervisor. This ensured that the field workers properly understood the instructions and could handle various interviewing problems during the interview (in the field). After completion of mock calls, a debriefing session was arranged in which the problems faced by the interviewers during the mock interviews were discussed and solutions suggested and recorded.

Initial Checking/Intake Edit

After the training, the interviewers went into the field for actual interviewing. A team comprising one male interviewer and one female interviewer worked under the supervision of a Field Supervisor. Field Supervisors observed at least 3 interviews of each interviewer for quality assurance. In case the work of an interviewer was not acceptable, he/she was disengaged from the survey. Field Supervisor was responsible to check the filled-in questionnaires before passing them to data coding/entry department. The problems or missing information identified during field edit were explained to the relevant interviewer and he/she was instructed to rectify them either through telephone and/or revisit the respondent for clarification and reasking the missing questions.

Supervision & Back Checking

Interviewers were supervised on the job and the work done by them was back checked. At least 20% back checking was done on work completed by each interviewer to ensure authenticity of data.

Data Entry and Verification

Once the questionnaires were received from the field, those were checked and the responses of open-ended questions were coded with the help of a code list.

After the coding of open-ended responses, data was entered into computers. PILDAT used the SPSS data entry programme that has flexibility to implement validity checks and skipping rules, etc. At least $20\,\%$ of its entered data was rechecked for the quality assurance.

After completion of data entries, all data was cleaned by using a data-cleaning program written in SPSS which is customized for every project according to the survey/questionnaire needs. Data was thoroughly checked for an omission, displacements and other errors resulting in inconsistencies with the coding scheme.


